Welcome to the REACH Trainee Grant Application Portal

Research into the Enhancement of Acute Care for Children's Health (REACH) is a research theme at Children's Hospital Research Institute of Manitoba (CHRIM) committed to improving the quality of acute care for children. Our purpose is to support innovative research that can lead to better health outcomes for young patients in Manitoba, Nunavut, and Northwestern Ontario. By fostering collaboration between researchers, healthcare providers, and families, we aim to tackle unique challenges in pediatric acute care.

To support our purpose, REACH offers two annual Trainee Grant awards worth \$7,000 each. These grants are designed to fund small, stand-alone projects that can foster engagement, and collaborations to develop research proposals and/or advance the science of patient, public and/or knowledge user engagement in pediatric acute care research.

Goals

- **Connectivity:** Connect researchers, healthcare providers, patients, and families to prioritize, generate, and mobilize pediatric acute care research.
- **Research Platform Establishment:** Establish a research platform embedded within clinical care, utilizing data to enhance pediatric acute care.
- **Training Excellence:** Provide a high-quality, safe, interdisciplinary research training environment to a diverse research team.

We encourage trainees at the University of Manitoba (e.g. undergraduate, masters, doctoral, post-doctoral fellow, medical resident) with a supervisor that can hold funds at UM and is dedicated to enhancing pediatric care to apply and contribute to this important work.

REACH Trainee Grant Assessment Criteria

The REACH External Review Committee will assess all applications that meet the submission requirements.

Major criteria used for evaluation include:

- Compliance with REACH Trainee grant guidelines.
- Relevance and significance to REACH strategic goals.
- Adequacy and feasibility of research plan, design, and methods.
- Budget and resource allocation are realistic and adhere to REACH guidelines.
- Relevant experience of the trainee supervisor/mentor.

REACH Trainee Grant Application Guidelines and Requirements

- This application form should be used to complete the grant application.

- All applications must be **electronically** submitted and are due on **May 29, 2026, before 4:00pm (CT)**. Late applications will not be accepted.
- Incomplete, inaccurate, or otherwise improperly prepared applications will NOT be reviewed.
- All applicants should hold REACH Membership or complete REACH Membership form before submitting their application.
- The Applicant is responsible for the research (e.g. supervisor/mentor) preparation, Only those with academic appointments may act as Applicant to facilitate the transfer of funds. Individuals without an academic appointment can hold the Co-Primary Applicant or Trainee can hold the Co-Primary Applicant role where applicable.
- Investigators may only submit one grant as Primary Applicant but may participate as Co- Applicant on additional applications.
